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Cleary-Flood Unit 10 on hold

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(Taunton, MA) – As a result of several factors, not the least of which is current economic conditions, the TMLP has placed the Unit 10 project on hold.

"Economic conditions and the resulting impact on electricity usage and natural gas prices have reduced the need for, and benefits of, additional generation at this time," explains Mike Horrigan, TMLP's General Manager. "We will continue to monitor the market closely and will be poised to move forward when conditions change. Our Cleary-Flood Generating Station remains a great site for future expansion where we have a highly-skilled workforce, an existing natural gas supply on location, transmission and cooling water access."

TMLP's power portfolio consists of long- and short-term power contracts, output from Units 8 & 9 and a myriad of renewables (such as landfill gas and hydro). Cleary-Flood Generating Station currently operates two generating units (8&9) with an output of 136 MW.

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
