TAUNTON MUNICIPAL LIGHTING PLANT RECOGNIZED AS A RELIABLE PUBLIC POWER PROVIDER

[Taunton, MA, April 30, 2018]— TMLP has earned a Reliable Public Power Provider (RP₃)[®] designation from the American Public Power Association for providing reliable and safe electric service. Neil James, Manager of Distribution Operations at Santee Cooper, South Carolina and chair of the Association's RP₃ Review Panel, presented the designations on April 30 during the Association's annual Engineering & Operations Technical Conference held in Raleigh, N.C.

The RP₃ designation, which lasts for three years, recognizes public power utilities that demonstrate proficiency in four key disciplines: reliability, safety, workforce development, and system improvement. Criteria include sound business practices and a utility-wide commitment to safe and reliable delivery of electricity. TMLP joins more than 240 public power utilities nationwide that hold the RP₃ designation.

“This designation is about more than just reliability. It’s about operational excellence,” said James. “These utilities and their communities should be proud to represent the best of the best in the areas of reliability, safety, workforce development, and system improvement.”
