Interoffice Communication from Jim Irving and Peter Botelho to Kim Holmes dated July 20, 2022: Subject: CM Towers Cooling Tower Additional Emergency Repair Authorization Request

Manager Holmes read the following memo into the record:

This is a request to amend the existing contract for CM Towers to perform emergency repairs to cells 1, 3 and 4 including the north and south end walls found damaged from a partial collapse of the cooling tower on February 7, 2022.

The additional damage was found during an inspection of cells 1, 3 and 4 while the emergency repair work was ongoing on cell 2. During this time, CM Towers and TMLP observed broken and buckling wood framing of end walls and other major structural members on the remaining cells. This additional work is part of the emergency repair authorization previously approved Major Project Request Number 1205 and emergency DCAM Waiver 4109.

Based on the above, TMLP requests authorization for CM Towers to extend the current contract to include emergency repairs of cells 1, 3 and 4 on the Unit #9 Cooling Tower for an additional \$6,753,900.

Commissioner Blackwell asked how we made out with the insurance company.

Manager Holmes responded that we have filled out all the paperwork and have been working with the insurance company. Manager Holmes asked Mr. Irving if he had any updates.

Mr. Irving stated that the current discussion with the insurance adjusters is there should not be any problems with this being covered by insurance.

Manager Holmes added that we have nothing in writing right now but all the feedback is that this will be covered.

Commissioner Blackwell added that I just wanted this to get out to the public that this will be covered by insurance.

Motion by Commissioner Corr, seconded by Commissioner Hebert to authorize the request for CM Towers to extend the current contract to include emergency repairs to cells 1, 3 and 4 on the Unit #9 Cooling Tower for an additional cost of \$6,753,900. Unanimous.
