Item #1 - 15 KV Pad-mounted Switchgear

The Transmission and Distribution Department is requesting to send out sealed bids for (1) 15KV padmounted switchgear. This switchgear is a part of the 1814.IP1 and 1814.IP2 upgrades which will increase reliability on John Quincy Adams Road and allow for future load growth. Approximate cost is \$200,000.

Item #2 - 15 KV Pad-mounted Switchgear with Primary Metering

The Transmission and Distribution Department is requesting to send out sealed bids for (1) 15 KV padmounted switchgear with primary metering. Approximate cost is \$75,000. This item is reimbursable.

RECOMMENDATION: T&D Engineering Department recommends this bid to be awarded to the Commonwealth of MA GBPC Procurement Program/MAPC Contract # IFB#GBPC2023-'24 International qualifying bidder which is Allegiance Trucks dba Minuteman Trucks Inc., Walpole, MA for the amount of \$829,141.00 for a total of two complete chassis, aerial device and body units subject to optional trade-in allowances to be determined at a later date.

Expected price of these units if Sealed Bid is \$450,000.00 each for a total of \$900,000.00 for two units; savings is estimated to be \$70,859.00 before trade-in allowance.

Commissioner DeMelo asked on the MA GBPC Procurement Program is there a minimum or maximum threshold that we have to abide by or as long as they are on the list it does not matter what we are buying.

Manager Holmes responded it has to be open for us to buy from because some of the State sealed bids are limited to who can actually use them. So as long as it is open to our entity to purchase from there is no minimum necessarily, it is defined on how that bid went out so each one is individual. In this case we are not limited on the maximum.

Motion by Commissioner Corr, seconded by Commissioner DeMelo to award the bid for bucket trucks to the Commonwealth of MA GBPC Procurement Program qualifying bidder Allegiance Trucks dba Minuteman Trucks for a total price of \$829,141.00 per the recommendation of the T&D Engineering Department. Commissioner DeMelo asked for clarity, you have been serving since March of 2023.

Manager Holmes responded I started in 2022 when I became General Manager to finish out the previous General Manager's term. My term should have started in 2023. I have been sitting on the Board the entire time.

Storm Report - December 17, 2023 Storm

Manager Holmes stated that the Transmission & Distribution Department provided a memo with an update on the storm from December 17th through December 18th as follows:

Preparatory Work:

Friday 12/15/2023

- Review and implement TMLP's Corporate Emergency Response Plan
- All crews to report December 17th at midnight. Winds started at 6:00 AM
- Stock all trucks, including gas
- Contact Mutual Aid teams for alertness
- Secure additional (2) tree crews

Storm response and restoration:

December 17th and December 18th 2023

- Damage Assessment:
 - Hurricane strength damage, 65+ MPH gusts 20-30MPH sustained to trees and poles resulting in substantial outages from the start of the storm on December 17th.
 - No Scada monitoring available. Back to basics.
- Damage:
 - Damages occurred from downed poles, wires (primary & secondary) and transformers throughout the TMLP service territory that consists of 100 square miles including the City of Taunton, Towns of Raynham, Berkley and North Dighton and a small section of Lakeville.
- Description of Damage:
 - Downed wires, poles and transformers at multiple locations in TMLP's service territory.
 Hardest hit areas were Raynham Locust Street, throughout Berkley and Taunton:
 Whittenton area, Fremont Street, Norton Avenue, South Crane Avenue, Bay Street and Scadding Street.
 - 115KV line S8 on National Grid operated and locked due to tree on White Street, Raynham.
- Emergency Protective Measures:
 - Implementation of EOP, preparation prior to the storm, staff & contractors brought in ahead of the storm.
 - Bring in all Transmission and Distribution Department ahead of storm starting Sunday morning at 12:00 midnight. Customer Service in at 4:00 AM. Extra Electric Station Operator also brought in.
 - o Two additional Northeastern Tree Crews brought in.
 - o Protecting public from down wires (energized).
 - Restoration Plan
 - √ Feeder Level
 - ✓ Main Line 3 Phase Level
 - ✓ Lateral Level
 - ✓ Single Transformer level Individual house service level
- Damage repairs mainly to do with downed trees.
 - (5) 13.8 KV Major Feeders: 1614.ET1, 1614.41, 1814.31, 1814.32, 1814.51, 2014.7
 - Some 13.8 circuits had to be repaired multiple times due to damage occurring at different times.
 - Major Switches: 38-VR (Berkley), 464-VR (Taunton), 174-VR (Berkley), 38-VR (Berkley).
 - (2) Secondary 4KV Feeders: 904.1 (Fremont), 304.2 (Kilton Street).
 - Multiple main lines down and repaired.

- o Multiple laterals repaired, all damaged and broken cutouts replaced.
- Numerous large trees cleared and removed off lines, Locust Street, Norton Avenue, South Crane Avenue, Lakeville Pump Station ROW between Precinct Street and Bedford Street.
- Over 50 house services repaired or replaced throughout service territory.
- 18 poles broken or needed to be replaced in Raynham, Taunton and Berkley: (5) by TMLP, (13) by Verizon including 3 on South Crane Avenue and Glebe Street and 2 on North Avenue.
- Communication wires and tree limbs had to be changed out over the next 2-3 days.
- All crews worked extremely efficient and safely and no accidents were reported.
- All customers scheduled to be re-energized by 20:30 on 12/18/2023.

Manager Holmes thanked everyone for their hard work during this storm and the windstorm the following weekend. It has been a crazy couple of weeks.

Commissioner Corr asked the National Grid line that went down, do we fix that or do they come in and fix it.

Manager Holmes responded that they come in and fix that because it is their transmission line.

Commission thanked everyone for their great work.

Commissioner DeMelo asked about no Scada monitoring available, back to basics. What does that mean?

Manager Holmes responded that we had a network issue prior to this and because of that we had to shut down some of our internal networks so communication to the folks in the field was not what we would normally have.

Commissioner DeMelo asked if SCADA is an acronym.

Mr. Sullivan responded Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition.

Commissioner DeMelo stated as Commissioner Corr said thank you to all the men and women. When you have to report at midnight to 65+ MPH winds and 20-30 MPH gusts it takes a special person to do that so thank you and the best report is everyone was safe.
